GLOSSARY:

Co-mediation:

In a complex mediation situation, clients and the mediator sometimes decide that having 2 mediators would help them in their discussions.

Direct Consultation with children:

Sometimes during mediation, parents decide that it would be helpful to ask their children for their views about some of the issues under discussion; this might include such matters as future contact arrangements and living arrangements. These sessions allow the views of children to be heard and included in family mediation. This often helps the parents to make informed decisions about their children's futures. This typically takes 3 sessions:

1. A planning session with the parents alone.
2. A session where the mediator meets with the children on their own.
3. A further session where the mediator feeds back to the parents, the views of their
4. Children.

C100/ FM1/ Form A:

Before making an application to Court, you must first attend a MIAM session with a mediator. If it is decided that mediation would not be appropriate for you, we can then issue the certified page of the C100/ FM1/ Form A

MIAMS (Mediation Information and Assessment Meeting):

This is an opportunity for you to find out what mediation can offer and decide if it is suitable for you. The mediator will be able to assess you for Legal Aid, find out what your current situation is and tell you about mediation. You will need to attend one of these meetings before you can make a Court application.

MOU (Memorandum of Understanding):

Your mediator will write this for you at the conclusion of your mediation sessions, if you have mediated on property, finance and child issues. It records all of the arrangements you have agreed during the course of your mediation sessions.

OFS (Open Financial Statement):

This is a record of your joint financial disclosure and is used by both clients as an agreed statement of your assets and liabilities that have been disclosed during your mediation sessions.

Parenting Agreement:

This document records all of the arrangements you have agreed with regard to your children. It may typically include such things as your pattern of contact with your children, any payments you will be making/ receiving, holiday periods or other important events for your children.

Shuttle Mediation:

Mediation where the clients are in separate rooms and the mediator "shuttles" between them.
